Building Vacant for Over 40 Years Undergoes an Asbestos Abatement Tulsa, Oklahoma

The Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) and the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma provided each one-milliondollar loans from their Brownfields Revolving Loan Programs with Fund grant funding provided by the United States Environmental Protection Agency for asbestos an abatement inside the Abundant Life Building. The loans provided collectively twomillion-dollars towards the removal of asbestos from inside the building. The abatement Dklahoma

allows for the building to be redeveloped.

The building sits in a prime location near downtown Tulsa and the Arkansas River. The building has sat vacant for over forty-years!

The Abundant Life Building was constructed in 1957 to serve as international headquarters for the Oral Roberts Evangelistic Association, Inc. The building is also called Diamond the Building because of its diamond-pattern facade.



The asbestos abatement was completed in January of 2022.

The current owners of the building plan are renovating the building into a residential development.
