DEQ provides assistance with assessment and remediation of city and county owned buildings around the state. Atoka, Ardmore and Hartshorne received assistance in FY 2022. This program provides an opportunity for properties to be revitalized and put back into productive use.


Orphan Hazardous Waste Site Cleanup

DEQ manages the operations and maintenance activities on recently cleaned up abandoned hazardous waste sites and will continue to monitor these sites to ensure they are safely reused. DEQ also continues to investigate other potential orphan hazardous waste sites.

Superfund Site Cleanup

DEQ Manages the site cleanup at several Superfund Sites and has a statutory obligation to fund 10 percent of the cleanup costs. The DEQ is currently focusing on protecting human health and the environment by cleaning up residential properties, parks and local watersheds within the Tar Creek Superfund Site, and managing the complex cleanup operations at the Oklahoma Refining Company.
